The Secretary-General has the honour to submit to the General Assembly and the Security Council the curriculum vitae of the candidate nominated by national groups for the election to fill a casual vacancy in the International Court of Justice caused by the death, on 28 September 1994, of Judge Nikolai Konstantinovitch Tarassov (Russian Federation).
